Assurance for a great tomorrow



In 1948 Alexander Draper established Cyn-San Collie Kennels. For fiftytwo years he has grown in our sport through breeding, exhibiting Collies and Pembroke Welsh Corgis. He participated in conformation, herding trials, and obedience. Currently he enjoys juggling AKC judging assignments with his philanthropic interest.

Following a business career of serv-

ing in executive roles for national and international corporations, he devotes most of his time lending his expertise to non-profit organizations including the Guggenheim Museum, the American Geographical Society and the Museum of the American Indian.

In addition to building from the ground up the Collie Club of America Foundation, Draper also founded the Doberman Pinscher Club of America



Foundation and has been instrumental in the formation of many other parent club foundations.

goals.

- · Help dogs live longer, healthier lives
- Respect the dedication and interest of dog clubs, breeder and owners in canine health and continuously seek ways to involve them in the work of the foundation
- Identify health issues of concern to dog owners and breeders
- Identify and sponsor research and education programs, with particular emphasis on canine genetics, that:
 - Meet the highest scientific and educational standards
 - Have the greatest potential for advancing the health of dogs
 - Have expectations for producing materials and applications that are reasonable and affordable



for breeders and owners

- Seek ways to integrate the observations and knowledge of dog owners, breeders, veterinarians and other scientists for the purpose of advancing the health of dogs
- Responsibly monitor grantees and make the results of their work available for public use through publication in scientific journals, and through sharing and dissemination of information and education with dog owners, breeders and veterinarians.
- Raise endowment funds for the foundation's programmatic purposes, and to invest these funds for both growth of principal and income adequate to advance the foundations

purposes.

So, what is on tap to raise the funds needed to achieve these ambitious goals?
