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her final projects. Kathy was the presenter for the Quarter Century Collie Group Hall of Fame induction of Grace Christie and Billy Ashenbrenner.

She was a member of the Commemorative Collie Stamp Committee. With her close friend, Dana Rodman, an accomplished artist, they were responsible for creating the cartoons of "Doll Face" and "Shadow" to generate interest in the Collie stamp, which became a reality in 1986.

















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Kathy worked with Paige Elliot in making the Collie gait film. It was during this project that she met filmmaker Paul Beck. He was impressed by her enthusiasm and commitment to the Collie, and for decades after that, he provided encouragement and technical support for her projects.
